Signup with Signup Genius

On November 1, 2019, Signup Genius will be used to allow Clay Studio Monitors to sign up for a specific date and time and see their signups in real time. Members who have signed up prior to November 1st, will have already been entered into the new system.

Everyone will be able to see the schedule as it is updated. This will replace our current Monitor Calendar. The Studio website will remain the same so that you can see the newsletter and all other pertinent sites.

<u>Sign up Genius</u> uses the member's email address and **you** will create a password for your Monitor sign up. It is a password you choose when you set up your account in signup genius.

The Service Committee's primary responsibility is to verify service. Those on the committee are Virginia Friend, Paula Worthley, Julie Jacques, John Carney, Debi Vetter, and Susan Vorhees.

We also ensure that the cubbies are used as intended – only those trained as a monitor who actually use the studio can be assigned a cubby. There are only 117 cubbies for almost 400 people so we're checking more diligently that they are being used correctly.

When we first started to use the service book and require service from all members there was much complaining about there not being enough slots for everyone. As it turned out there were 144 members who have never been into the studio this year. There are about 50 more members who are not required to monitor because they have other service, such as the Kiln Committee.

Right now, we have about 180 monitoring slots in a normal month when the studio is open 7 days a week. And there's a whole bunch of cleaning that can be done as an alternative to monitoring.

THANK YOU to the 90% of the members who got trained as monitors, who clock in, who do their service, who sign the service book in the right place, and who contact the Service Committee when they cannot do their service.

If you expect the Service Committee to read your mind and "keep track of what you intended to do", you should know that I failed Mind Reading classes in college and graduate school.

We really don't want to suspend anyone's membership. And we don't think we should have to chase you down and remind you about your service. Please put the correct email address on your new membership form so we can contact you if necessary.

Bio Info: Began ceramics classes in 1971 at Northwest Missouri State University and graduated in 1974 with a BS in Elementary/Secondary Ed with a Ceramics Concentration. I completed my MS in Secondary Art Education/Ceramics in 1976 at Southern IL University and taught art to elementary students, EC-12th grade for 11 years in southern Illinois. In January 1988 I moved to southern AZ and just happened in GV when GVR needed a substitute teacher for their clay classes while the instructor/studio supervisor had surgery. They hired me when he decided not to return and I stayed on for a year. At that time the clay studio was located at Desert Hills Social Center. I was a full time employee, M-F and taught all the wheel classes, supervised the studio and purchases of materials, etc. In spring of 1989 I packed up my bicycle and headed to Europe for an adventure. My time teaching GVR members at DH clay studio was a wonderful experience, with a very talented, enthusiastic and welcoming membership. In addition, I worked for the City of Tucson, Parks and Recreation Dept., supervising the Sunday open pot shop at Randolph Park for a while and was hired as a wheel throwing instructor when the city opened the clay studio at Udall Center. I have taught all ages and welcome the opportunity to introduce GVR members interested in learning how to throw on the wheel. I also was employed by the Univ. of AZ and N. AZ University and retired from NAU in 2011. After selling my cabin in Show Low, AZ I returned to Green Valley in 2017 feeling I had come full circle.


